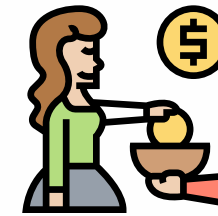

NEW GOALS

Why is a tithe 10%? The first appearance of a tithe is in Genesis 14, when Abraham gives a tenth of the spoils to Melchizedek. Later, Leviticus 27:30 formalizes it: "A tenth of everything... belongs to the Lord."

In the ancient world, 10% symbolized a full, representative portion. It was large enough to require trust, but not so large that it destroyed a household. In other words, it was costly enough to be meaningful.

What is God really asking? God wasn't asking for 10% of people's money as much as He was asking for 100% of their trust.

The tithe functioned as: A) A confession – "Everything I have comes from God", B) A reordering of priorities – God first, not leftovers, and C) A discipline of dependence – learning to live on what remains.

That's why the prophets could say God wasn't interested in offerings without faithfulness of heart (see Malachi 3:8–10).

The New Testament does not command a strict percentage, but it assumes generosity shaped by grace (2 Corinthians 8–9). Historically, the church has viewed the tithe as a baseline, not a ceiling, it's training wheels for generosity, and a way of forming disciples, not funding the church.

For many Christians, tithing remains a wise, biblical rhythm—not because God needs 10%, but because we need the discipline of giving first.
